Jeremy Cullen - Bio

Jeremy Cullen (b. 1976) is a New Zealand composer and pianist whose music draws on his diverse experience as a composer for film and theatre soundtracks, his classical training and his work in recording studios as a sound editor/sound designer.

Jeremy began playing piano at the age of 6 and won the Westpac School Music Contest Composition Competition in 1993. While at high school he had informal lessons with Christchurch composer **John Ritchie** and performed his own piano concerto with the NZ Secondary Schools Symphony Orchestra. He subsequently studied composition, piano and electroacoustic/computer music at Canterbury University with composers John Cousins and Elaine Dobson.

After leaving university he worked for ten years (1999-2009) as sound engineer and composer at Wellington recording studio Marmalade Audio where he learnt the art of producing, recording, mixing and mastering – skills he uses today to release his own music on his record label Notornis Music.

Since becoming a freelance composer and sound designer in 2009 he has established a career as a self-released recording artist, as well as maintaining a roster of clients in the film, television, advertising, game and theatre industries.

As music editor, he has worked on film-scores such as Howard Shore's score for Peter Jackson's film **The Hobbit: The Battle of the Five Armies**, composed original music for the **Behind the Scenes** special features on the DVD release of **The Hobbit**, and edited the music of **Nick Cave and Warren Ellis** for the Peter Jackson-produced documentary **West of Memphis**.

His first album **Scenes Vol. 1** (2016) was described by American Record Guide as "A series of exquisite miniatures: interesting, expressive, and surprising melodies, coupled with traditional sounding harmonies that often lead the ear to other places than expected."

The soundtrack album to the haunting horror film **Blackspot** was released in 2018 and features piano played by the composer with string players from the **New Zealand Symphony Orchestra**.

Into 2020 his string quartet track *Arabesque* was selected for the *Classical New Releases – Spotify Picks* playlist in 2020, gaining him over 100,000 streams. He is currently one of the most popular New Zealand classical composers on streaming services, with over 20,000 monthly listeners.
